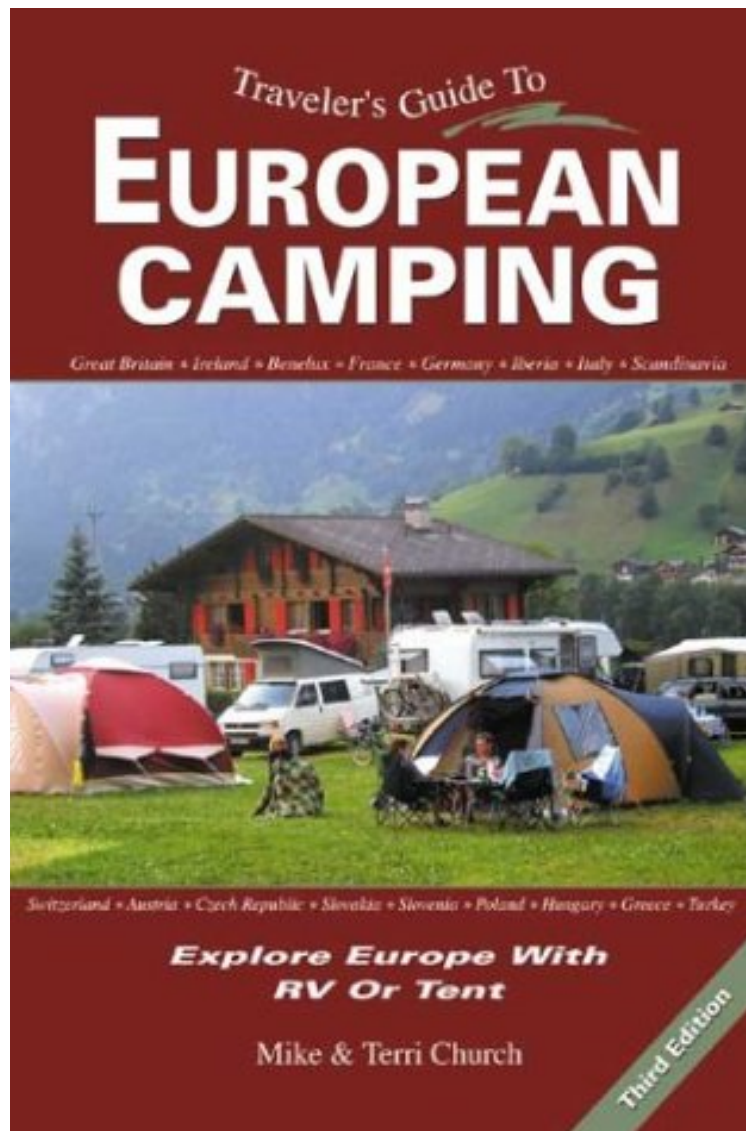

Good Starting Point but Inaccurate Maps and Information By Joe Pepitone First, the pros: This book does provide a comprehensive list of camping sites within Europe. However, more care needs to be taken regarding the research and actual descriptions of the campsites. As a former officer in the Marine Corps, I believe my map reading skills are accurate. However, the poor map descriptions and often just wrong details were a never-ending source of frustrations. Inaccurate map with incorrect street addresses, map not pointing north, etc., were just one of many examples we discovered. I know the authors recommended GPS but I did not feel it was necessary to skimp on actual accurate directions or maps. Melk, Austria was a perfect example of this. Another example was the section on Amsterdam. We chose a recommended camping ground because the description said it provided free warm showers and laundry facilities. Upon checking in it turned out that the showers were cold (no hot water option), they had to be paid for (as was the laundry) and there was no toilet paper provided! To be fair there are accurate descriptions as well, but I would forewarn buyers that not all camping grounds are accurately described and I have doubts whether the authors had personally visited them in a number of years. It was almost a joke between my wife and I by the end of our trip for when we would have our 'Mike and Terry' argument in the process of finding our campground! To summarize: a good list of actual camping grounds but take the descriptions and directions with a grain of salt.
