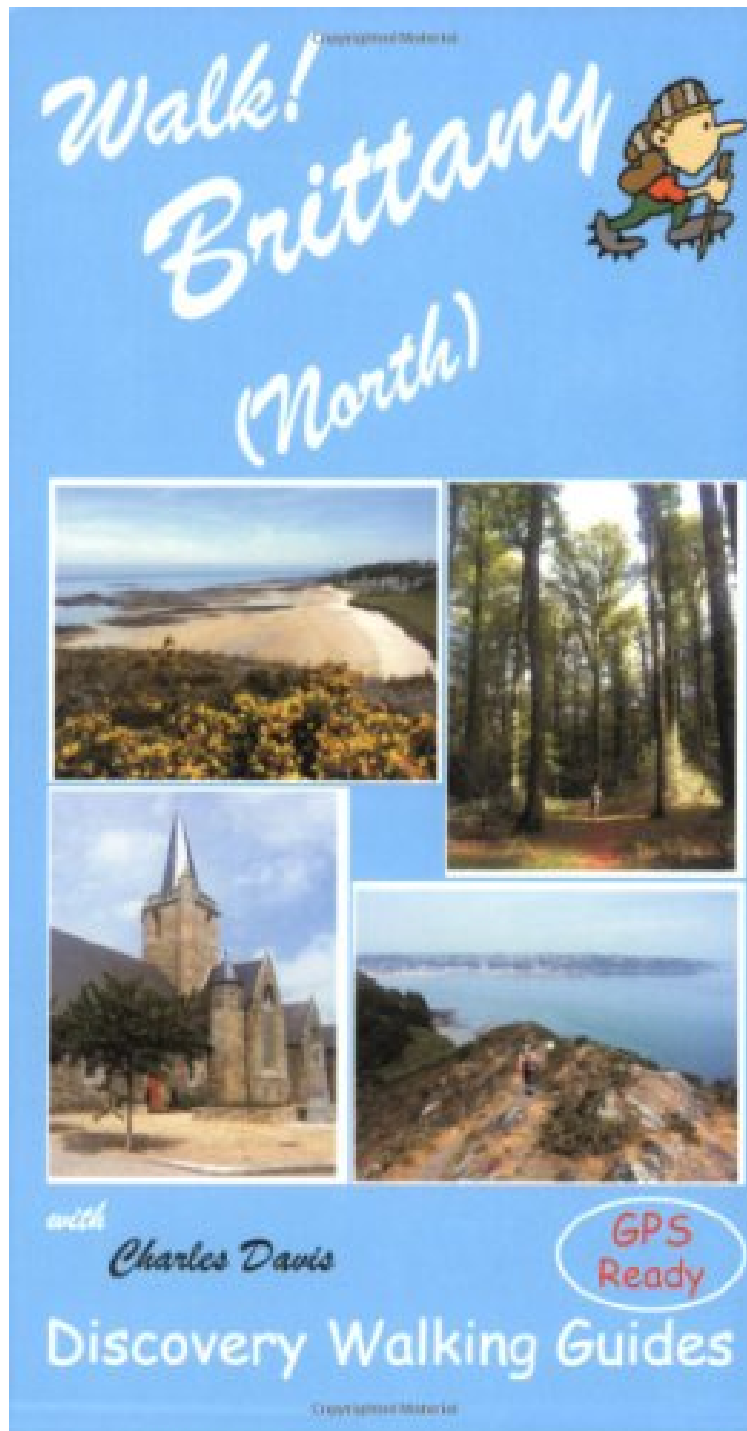

Boasting more than 3,000 kilometres of waymarked paths, a tourist infrastructure that is highly developed without being obtrusive, and regular budget flights, the region has all you need for a long-weekend away or a full walking holiday. Aimed at both the casual visitor and the long-term resident, this book details the extraordinary variety of walking in Brittany, from easy strolls to challenging long-distance outings, featuring forty itineraries in Finistere, Cotes d'Armor, and Ille et Vilaine. Walking routes include: walking route summary; ratings for Effort, Time, Distance, Ascents/Descents, Refreshments and Vertigo-risk; fully detailed walking description, including frequent timings to aid navigation and check your progress; GPS waypoints at every key point on every route; full colour 1:25,000 scale IGN licensed mapping for each route; short walk and stroll alternatives

The book is well laid out, with clear maps and consistently good directions which make it easy to follow, just as you would expect. What sets it apart however is Davis' style and approach, there's variety in his walks and an attention to detail that shows he wants you to enjoy them as much as he seems to himself. Not only did we have some memorable walks, along wind-swept coasts and through tranquil forests but we also saw a side of Brittany we might otherwise have missed. We'll be back, with 40 walks to choose from there's a few more we'd like to do and Brittany is fine walking country.
