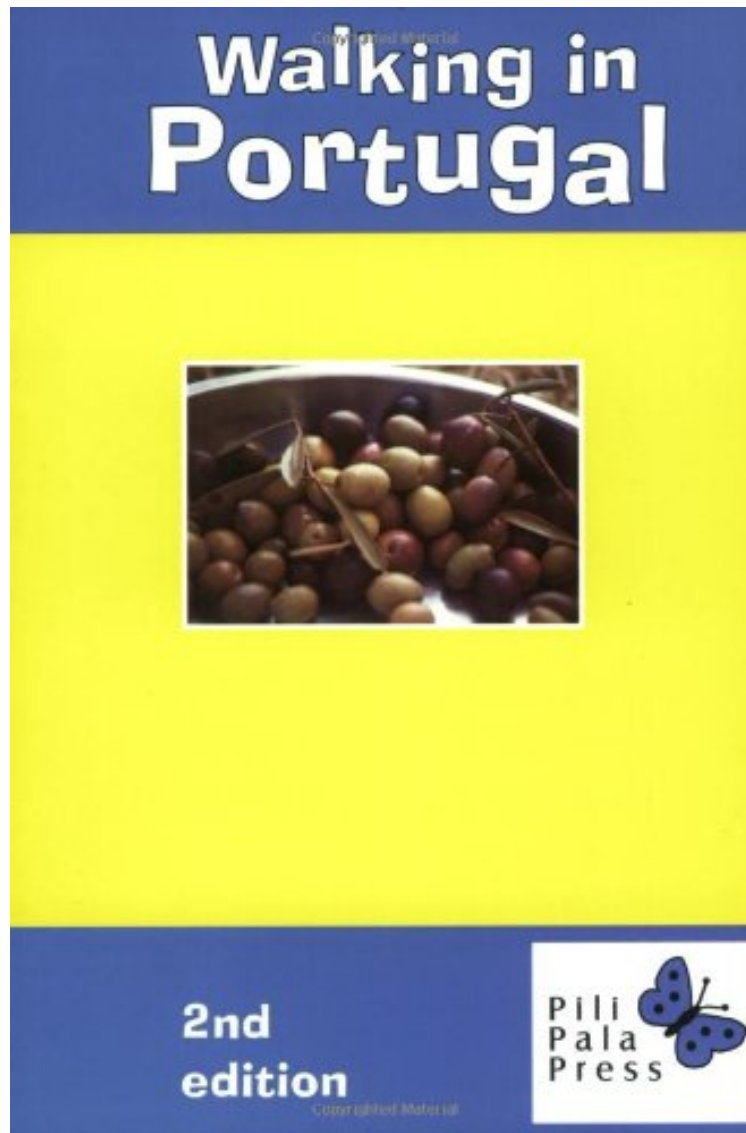


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Walking in Portugal

A bit of common sense and a map go a long way toward compensating for any of the book's shortcomings. Like most of southern Europe, hiking is not a popular recreation (walking for fun??), so if you get lost don't expect anyone to know anything about where you were

trying to go. But some of the walks are real gems, taking you far from the crowds and in among beautiful quintas and forgotten villages.
