The essence of this plot-less book are the slightly irreverent observations she makes of the people and circumstances surrounding her. These are something less than truly 'malicious' as the title might imply, though they are so consistently entertaining that this book can be read just a few pages at a time, possibly as an antidote to any stresses or boredom in one's daily life. The stories and her comments are devilishly uplifting, sort of like very good coffee. The dose depends upon just how much of this particular type of enjoyment one cares to add to their daily routine. The title, taken light-heartedly, perfectly fits the contents of the book.
